

Potty Training Success – Quick and Easy Tips

My dog is still peeing or pooping in the house! What should I do? Just ask someone who has 8 dogs and raised dozens of puppies! All of ours are house broken at 12-16 weeks. Hope this will benefit you!



Step 1 – Preparing 🐾

- Associate a potty word. We use “Outside”.
- Say potty word whenever dog goes #1 or #2 in a regular tone of voice to associate it no matter where the dog goes. This will take a week.
- Associate a no word. We use “No!” – low pitched, louder. Your dog should already know this!
- Associate a yes word. We use “Good!” – high pitched. It’ll only take a few treat sessions using the yes word for them to understand it’s a good thing!

Step 2 – Action 📺

- Tone is important. If you catch your dog going in an undesirable area, use your “no” word with your potty word in a low pitched tone. i.e “No outside!”. A loud hand clap while in the act (over 6 months of age) can also be included.
- If you catch your dog going where he or she should be going combine your high pitched yes word with your potty word “Good Outside!”.
- This should improve over a week or two.

Step 3 – Command ☑️

- After a few weeks to a month of your dog hearing outside combined with the yes word, you should be able to command them to go to the bathroom by saying “Outside!” – High pitched.
- We use this when we travel with our dogs to hurry them along, and follow with a treat after the deed is done. Ours are pad trained during travel, which works wonders!
